Reports. County Councillor, District Councillors, Parish Paths Warden, Parish Tree Warden.

Cllr C Smith (County Councillor) had sent the following report;

He had allocated funds from his discretionary fund to complete the repairs to the footpath by the Village Shop. Instructions have been given to the WCC Highways to do this work which is expected to be completed in the next few weeks.

Cllr A Warburton (District Councillor) reported;

Some further staff changes were taking place at MHDC with a view to improving the efficiency and cost-effectiveness of the District Council.
On the matter of Refuse Collections he and his colleagues were opposed to any reduction in these and he did not expect any changes in the timetable for collections.
No local planning matters had come before the Northern Area Development Committee recently and he asked to be informed on any controversial items if they arise.

Mr D Fowler - Parish Tree Warden had sent the following report;

I regret I shall be unable to attend, having only just returned from Harrogate.
Since the last meeting I have attended a talk on the 'Ancient Trees of Worcestershire' organised by Worcestershire Wildlife Trust, however unfortunately we do not seem to have any in Alfrick and Lulsley that fall within this category.

Cllr G Lowe - Parish Paths Warden reported;

Since the beginning of the year some additional work has been identified and WCC Footpaths Office have agreed to provide additional funds to enable these projects to be completed. (About £80).
A new bridge will be provided in the Knapp and Papermill Reserve to replace to one swept away in the July floods but there will be some delay as this is a major project.
He is busy replacing lost and installing new Waymarks and would appreciate information on any that are missing. He had noted that on some paths landowners had installed temporary electric fences to constrain horses and had advised owners of the illegality of such arrangements.
