

Here is a little bit of info that you many consider putting on the website, which may be useful to our members who do online banking!!!

Keystroke logging (often called keylogging) is the practice of noting (or logging) the keys struck on a keyboard, typically in a covert manner so that the person using the keyboard is unaware that their actions are being monitored. There are numerous keylogging methods, ranging from hardware- and software-based to electromagnetic and acoustic analysis.

In order to prevent Keyloggers tracking your keyboard actions, their activities can be outwitted by using the online monitor keyboard, when entering passwords and other information that you wish to keep as secure as possible.

In Windows XP go to: Start/All Programmes/ Accessories/Accessibility/On-Screen Keyboard. Presumably people using Vista Operating System can also access this 'Monitor Keyboard'.

This displays a virtual keyboard on your monitor for you to use with your mouse, whilst not guaranteed to fool all viruses, Trojans etc, it's an additional security option, which could possibly outwit many of the online loggers, that all online banking people should be aware of.
