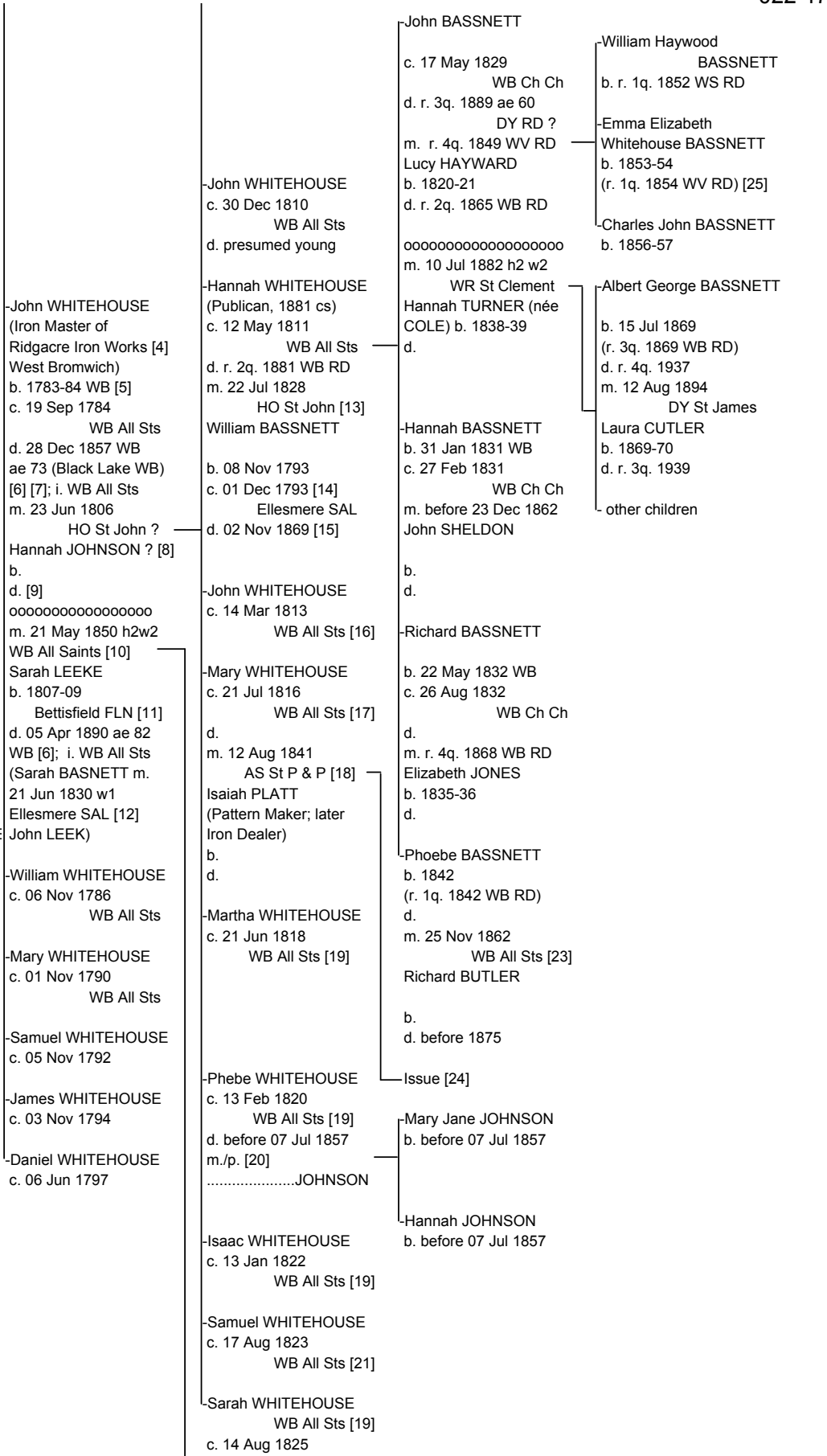


Notes

1. This is the marriage that best fits the proposed sequence of children from 1777 to 1797.
2. Father: Richard DEELEY (no mother named). He was also father of a Hannah DEELEY c. 02 Sep 1753 & Ann DEELEY c. 21 Mar 1756, both WB All Sts
3. Strangely, on the very same day that Mary WHITEHOUSE was baptised, another William WHITEHOUSE married Hannah DEELEY. Perhaps Hannah & Sarah were sisters (see Note 2 above) and either the two William WHITEHOUSEs were cousins or the second one was mis-named in the church register.
4. Ridgacre or Ridgeacre Iron Works is mentioned in directories from 1834 to 1872. In 1834 the firm was GILBERT, WHITEHOUSE & CO. and in 1835 UNDERHILL, WHITEHOUSE & JOHNSON. A boiler explosion occurred there in 1852.
5. This date of birth is deduced from age at death.
6. Date from memorial inscription at WB All Saints.
7. John WHITEHOUSE left a will in which he mentions his sons Richard, Moses, & John, his dau. Ann (without surname) and grandchildren Mary Jane and Hannah JOHNSON, children of his late dau. Phoebe JOHNSON.

There is a bequest to his clerk, Joseph DANKS, who is living with him at the 1841 cs and who died from chronic rheumatism ae 31 on 06 Jun 1868. Death cert. in the name of Joseph Danks WHITEHOUSE of High St WB, informant: Hannah BLINCOW, same address.

8. Most likely marriage, being the nearest to date of baptism of first child in the proposed sequence, and because their dau. Phoebe m. a JOHNSON. Also JOHNSON occurs twice elsewhere in these notes.

9. Hannah might have died before the 1841 cs, since she is not shown there with John WHITEHOUSE, but they might simply have split up.

10. The late marriage, by licence, shows John's father, William, to be a nailer and Sarah's to be Richard BASNETT, a butcher. Wit. John & Ann Maria LANCASTER.

11. Bettisfield is a village on the Shropshire Union Canal, just inside Wales. It fell within the parish of Hanmer. The parish registers to 1812 have been transcribed by Clwyd Fam. Hist. Soc.
